

#IpevLive | “Transition from violence : lessons from the MENA region”, 8 live conversations

PARIS, April 26, 2021- The Foundation Maison des sciences de l’homme is launching a series of eight live conversations “Transition from violence : Lessons from the MENA region”. #IpevLive will take place **every Tuesday at 5pm CET from May 18 to June 29, 2021.**

Prominent scholars and representatives of international organisations and civil society will engage in a series of **one-hour conversations** focused on achieving transitions from violence by understanding and applying lessons from the Middle East and North Africa.

These live conversations will revolve around three main themes:

- 1/ The long tail of the Arab Spring and its unresolved root causes.
- 2/ The MENA region post-covid
- 3/ Perspectives from the MENA region on future opportunities to exit violence

#IpevLive will be moderated by Hal Plotkin, an American journalist and broadcaster and a former Senior Policy Advisor in the administration of the U.S. President Barack Obama.
